Free and Reduced-Price School Meals**

Dear Parent /Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. The School District of Springfield Township offers healthy meals every school day. High School Breakfast costs \$1.50. Elementary School Lunch costs \$2.50, Middle School Lunch costs \$2.85, and High School Lunch costs \$2.85. Your children may qualify for free meals or for free reduced price meals. Reduced price meals cost \$0.30 per Breakfast (High School only) and \$0.40 per Lunch. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information.

Please make an effort to complete the application by September 30, 2011 to ensure timely processing. Families can also apply online for free or reduced meals, and other assistance benefits, at www.compass.state.pa.us or follow the link located on the home page of www.sdst.org.

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child?
No. Use one *Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application* for all students in your household.
2. Who can get free meals?
All children in households receiving benefits from the **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)** or **Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)** and most foster children can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits of the **Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines**.
3. Who can get reduced price meals?
Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits of the **Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines**.
4. Can Foster children get free meals?
Yes, foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court, are eligible for free meals. Any foster child in the household is eligible for free meals regardless of income and should be included on the household application. They are no longer considered a household of one.
5. Can homeless, runaway, and migrant children get free meals?
If you haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call **Melissa Levin** at **215-233-6000 extension 2014** to see if they qualify.

6. Should I fill out an application if I received a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free meals?
Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the counselor at your child's school if you have questions.
7. My child's application was approved last year; Do I need to re-apply for this current school year?
Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first 30 operating days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child has been directly certified for free meals for the new school year.
8. I get WIC; can my child(ren) get free meals?
Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out an application.
9. Will the information I give be checked?
Yes and we may also ask you to send written proof.
10. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later if my financial situation changes?
Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year.
11. What if my income is not always the same?
List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
12. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application?
You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: **The School District of Springfield Township, Business Administrator, 1901 East Paper Mill Road, Oreland, PA 19075, phone: 215-233-6000.**
13. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?
Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
14. Who should I include as members of my household?
You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends). You must include yourself and all children living with you.
15. We are in the military; do we include our housing allowance as income?
If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the **Military Housing Privatization Initiative**, do not include your housing allowance as income.
16. My spouse is deployed to a combat zone, is his/her combat pay counted as income?
No, if the combat pay is received in addition to his/her basic pay because of his/her deployment and it wasn't received before he/she was deployed, combat pay is not counted as income. Contact your school for more information.
17. My family needs more help, are there other programs we might apply for?
To find out how to apply for **SNAP** or other assistance benefits, contact your local county assistance office or call **1-800-692-7462 (1-800-451-5886)** TDD numbers for individuals with hearing impairments).

Privacy Act Statement: This explains how we will use the information you give us.

The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your child for free or reduced price meals. You must include the last four digits of the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. The last four digits of the social security number is not required when you apply on behalf of a foster child or you list a Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) case number or other FDPIR identifier for your child or when you indicate that the adult household member signing the application does not have a social security number. We will use your information to determine if your child is eligible for free or reduced price meals, and for administration and enforcement of the lunch and breakfast programs. We MAY share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them evaluate, fund, or determine benefits for their programs, auditors for program reviews, and law enforcement officials to help them look into violations of program rules.
